



The History Corner



Sandy Grieve has never failed to step in when needed and his latest "Save" was taking on the Newsletter after Edie Walters left us. He did a superb job of making the transition to our present digital copy, and Paul Winward and Nancy Ware have a tall order to follow in his path. Thank you Sandy for all you do for RBYC.



The newsletter was originally called "The Newsletter," and after editing it for several years, Edie Walters thought it needed a real name, so she held a contest and asked the members to name the paper. Commodore **Gayden White** came up with the name **The Star.** The Board thought it fit, so from that time forward it was called The Star.

Changes with The Star

There is a lot of colorful history since this Greatest Little Yacht Club began back in 1978. We are hoping to bring some of these stories alive for you each month. And what better place to start than the history of The Star!

Natalie Firstenberg, a "seasoned" legal secretary who had worked for a large law firm in Manhattan before marrying Harry, our first Commodore, created the first newsletter.

She then groomed **Edie Walter** who sent out The Star for many years before she left us for her home state of Texas last year.

"I was really nervous when Natalie informed me that she would like me to take over as secretary" says Edie. "My greatest concern was the fact that I had never taken minutes of a meeting, but she put my mind at ease and mentored me every step of the way. It wasn't long before I learned the hang of it, and I continued to learn throughout the years.

"She also taught me how to edit the newsletter. There were articles for each of the four flag officers, and she ghost-wrote for all but the Commodore. I followed suit until one year when I decided to get out of it. Two members took over the newsletter and realized it required more time and work than they were willing to give. I resumed editing at the request of some of the members and insisted that each flag officer write his own column."

Edie would collect articles, edit the newsletter, print the newsletter, collate the newsletter, stuff envelopes, lick stamps and get The Star out to all our membership every month. Edie recollects that "Hank Chapman made assembling the newsletter fun. At one time, he had an office on one of San Francisco's piers. When I arrived, he always had a drink and snacks ready. In order to save the club money, we did all of the collating and stapling ourselves. We folded and stuffed, and all the while Hank would recall much of the early years of the club and its members, some of whom I didn't know. He was a natural storyteller, and I looked forward to these "stuffing sessions" because I learned so much about RBYC."

When Edie left last year, it was decided that we would have an on-line newsletter only. **Sandy Grieve** valiantly volunteered to get it going and he did a wonderful job. Now that he has it up and running on our web page, he is passing the baton on to **Nancy Ware** and **Paul Winward**. Paul will collect the material from our members and officers and Nancy will put them together.
